





Healthcare Public Sector Autonomy

What is the rationale for Autonomy of Public Hospitals?



Hospitals are likely to perform sub-optimally under inflexible civil service rules and possibly misaligned public sector incentives.



If social health insurance is introduced, hospitals need autonomy to keep revenue, perceive the incentive signals and respond to them with the expected behavioral change.



MOH can focus on stewardship and regulatory actions, rather than be engrossed in day to day hospital management.




Improves the objectivity of the MOH as compared to the situation when hospitals are owned and managed by Ministry of Health
