



Diagnosis Related Groups (DGR)

Diagnosis Related Groups (DRGs) is a system to classify hospital cases into one of originally 467 groups.

DRGs are assigned by a "Grouper" program based on:



- International Classification of Diseases (ICD) diagnoses
- Procedures
- Age
- Sex
- Discharge status
- Complications and Comorbidities



- ✓ Availability of data that reflects accurately the clinical processes in the hospital
- ✓ Accurate Statistics
- ✓ Allows comparison with other hospitals
- ✓ Enable claim from the SHIFA fund and Private insurance companies
- ✓ To have an input in the proposed pay for productivity scheme for all health care professionals.

HOW IT WORKS

A DRG code is a number created by a software called a DRG Grouper

This number is used as a way to claim finances from the national insurance fund or a private insurance company

This number reflects the resources used to treat a specific patient during their hospital stay

All this information is fed into the software and a DRG is created

The DRG Grouper creates this number based on the demographical information of the patient, main diagnosis, co-morbidities, surgical procedures and many other factors

A new committee is operational to oversee the implementation of DGRs and other international coding scheme as well as prepare both doctors and coders to implement the system.
