





Considerations for rehabilitation centers serving people with disabilities



Disinfect the center on a daily basis and provide hand sanitizing stations at entrances as well as throughout the facility



Promote good health practices, such as washing your hands thoroughly and often for at least 20 seconds



Provide each individual with their own assistive products; shared equipment must regularly be cleaned and disinfected



Enforce use of masks and maintain social distancing at all times

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Measure the temperature of all employees and trainees on a daily basis and deny entry to anyone with a temperature of 37.5 degrees Celsius or higher - all suspected COVID-19 cases must be reported




Reduce the student-coach ratio to 1:1



The Ministry of Labor will conduct random inspections to identify and take legal action against violators



Preserve service continuity by developing a post COVID-19 operations plan that weighs the potential risks and the benefits of remote programs
