



The National Medical Taskforce

adopts a COVID-19 Alert Level Traffic Light System based on positivity rates to guide sector activities across the Kingdom of Bahrain.

According to the assessment of the average percentage of cases to numbers of tests over the last 14 days, it was decided, starting from Friday, 2 July 2021, to adopt the yellow alert level within the COVID-19 Alert Level Traffic Light System.



COVID-19 Alert Level Traffic Light System:



Consists of 4 levels based on the average percentage of cases to tests, in addition to the level of occupancy in intensive care unit, as follows:


Alert levels	Average percentage of existing cases
Green	When the rolling average percentage of positive cases out of tests carried out is below 2% for 14 days .
Yellow	When the rolling average percentage of positive cases out of tests carried out is between 2 – 5% for 7 days .
Orange	When the rolling average percentage of positive cases out of tests carried out is between 5% and less than 8% for 4 days .
Red	When the rolling average percentage of positive cases out of all tests carried out is 8% or more for 3 days.

The medical team noted that some dates may be designated by the National Medical Taskforce at higher alert levels if deemed necessary to the health and safety of all.











COVID-19 Alert Level Traffic Light System

Alert levels	Average percentage of existing cases
Green	When the rolling average percentage of positive cases out of tests carried out is below 2% for 14 days .
Yellow	When the rolling average percentage of positive cases out of tests carried out is between 2 – 5% for 7 days .
Orange	When the rolling average percentage of positive cases out of tests carried out is between 5% and less than 8% for 4 days .
Red	When the rolling average percentage of positive cases out of all tests carried out is 8% or more for 3 days.

- Moving from a higher alert level to a lower one would require staying at the same level for a period of no less than a week.
- Moving up from a lower alert level to a higher one can be immediate.
- For example, it would be possible to directly move from the green to the red level without going through the yellow and orange levels if the data indicated the need to.
- The thresholds set for each alert level is subject to change according to data and developments.
