

Resolution No. (22) of 2021

Continuing to implement the Provisions of Resolution No. (64) of 2020 regarding some Preventive Measures that should be taken when purchasing some Goods from Commercial and Industrial Shops to control and prevent the Spread of the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)

The Minister of Health:

After perusing the Public Health Law promulgated by Law No. (34) of 2018, particularly Articles (43) and (44) thereof,

And Resolution No. (12) of 2020 on Identifying Communicable Diseases,

And Resolution No. (64) of 2020 regarding some Preventive Measures that should be taken when purchasing some Goods from Commercial and Industrial Shops to control and prevent the Spread of the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19),

And Resolution No. (88) of 2020 on Continuing and Amending some Provisions of Resolution No. (64) of 2020 regarding some Preventive Measures that should be taken when purchasing some Goods from Commercial and Industrial Shops to control and prevent the Spread of the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19),

And the Coordination Committee Decision No. (370-2021) in its Meeting on 25 February 2021 regarding the Approval of the Proposal to extend the Validity of the Provisions of Resolutions regarding some Precautionary Measures and Requirements to face the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19),

And pursuant to the proposal of the Undersecretary of the Minister,

The following has been decided:

First Article:

The provisions of Resolution No. (64) of 2020 shall continue to be implemented regarding some Preventive Measures that should be taken when purchasing some Goods from Commercial and Industrial Shops to control and prevent the Spread of the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) until 31 May 2021.

Second Article:

The Undersecretary of the Minster and those concerned, each in their respective capacity, shall implement the provisions of this resolution, which shall come into effect from the date of its publication in the Official Gazette.
